## Support/ Education Sessions

In conjunction with Dr Lisa Juckes education and training sessions can be hosted either in person or online via zoom or Microsoft Teams. The training sessions are based on requests from individual services and are tailored to suit the desired outcome of the service. The training/education session topics in the past have included trauma informed care, vaping, brain mapping, alcohol dependence and many more. These sessions can be held at the same time as case reviews either over one day or two days.

### **Case / Clinical Reviews**

The team and Dr Lisa Juckes, Addiction Psychiatrist can offer both case and clinical reviews by request and referral form. The sessions are funded by the BMDAN, and can be individual ( worker and Lisa), collaboratively (worker, Lisa, and patient) or in a group setting. However in a group setting de-identifying the patient is a requirement for confidentiality purposes. If you would like more information or a referral form please reach out to the team
